- The top part of the screen contains the Flash player (1) – click anywhere in this bar to **start or pause the audio**. The slider can be dragged to any point in the text/song.
- The rest of the screen shows and updates the interlinear text, as the sound plays.
- **To hear a sentence again** click the bar at the top (1) to pause, and then click the individual play button next to the sentence (2).
 - When you are ready to carry on, click on the bar at the top (1) again and it will resume the text.
- You can of course **scroll up or down** to any sentence at any time while the bar at the top is paused. This will not affect the position of the main slider (1).
- If there is **too much detail** displayed, toggle the 'Simplify display' tick box (3) at the top of the page.
- To listen to a **different text**, click on 'Return to texts' (4)
